






- University entrance qualification (e.g. school leaving certificate, bachelor's certificate)
 - ➔ Proof that your previous degree has at least 180 ECTS
- Passport
- Curriculum vitae
- For enrollment: Electronic health insurance certificate
- If needed: German language certificate at level A2
- If needed: English language certificate at level C1
- Older language test scores (like IELTS) should be OK. If you want to be sure, please ask the admission department: bewerbung.master@hs-ansbach.de or studierendenservice.sco@hs-ansbach.de or studierendenservice.sco@hs-ansbach.de or studierendenservice.sco@hs-ansbach.de





- **VPD:** As an international student you also need a VPD (preliminary examination document) of your university entrance qualification, which is issued for a fee by <u>uni-assist e.V.</u> If you have refugee status, the processing fee can be waived via an <u>application</u>. For this, submit your original documents alongside an officially certified German or English translation to uni-assist e.V. The assessment takes up to 4-6 weeks to process your documents. Therefore, please submit your documents early.
- **APS**: Applicants from the People's Republic of China (<u>APS China</u>), Vietnam (<u>APS Vietnam</u>) and India (<u>APS India</u>) need an APS certificate. It must be submitted to the university during the application procedure.






Degree

To receive a *preliminary* assessment of your university entrance qualification, you can use the <u>anabin database</u> (German only).

Grade

To convert your grade, you can use the <u>German Grade Calculator</u>. Please bear in mind that this is only a rough guide. What will count is the VPD.












- German is the preferred language of most companies in the region

- ICE Intercity Express
- IC Intercity
- **RE** Regional Express Trains (Regionalexpress)
- **RB**Regional Trains (Regionalbahn)**S-Bahn**(Sub-)urban train (Schnellbahn)**U-Bahn**Metro

fastest train (most expensive – special ICE ticket necessary) fast train (less expensive than ICE – ICE ticket is not valid) slower train, many stops (valid tickets: Deutschland Ticket, Bavaria Ticket, single tickets) slowest train with most stops (all tickets valid) slower than RE and RB, connects cities and hinterland slower than S-Bahn, mainly suburban

Living in Ansbach

There are beautiful, inexpensive apartments in Ansbach and the surrounding areas. The halls of residence provide apartments and a wide variety of private accomodation is also available.

Halls of residence

- Also consider to look for a place to stay in Nuremberg or in the surroundings of Ansbach.
- Contact landlords/ roomates or create your own ad ("Gesuche") where you introduce yourself

- Be careful with scams! <u>Never</u> give out credit card details, preferably pay cash if possible or via PayPal or bank transfer.





When contacting landlords or potential roommates...

...write in German (you can also use Google translate)

...mention that you are still learning German so they understand why you make language mistakes

...briefly tell them who you are, where you are from and the reason of your stay (student or professional)

- Have a look at the apartment / room <u>before</u> you move in (if possible)
- Always ask for a Handover Protocol "Übergabeprotokoll" where damages are indicated; it is done before you move in and after you move out
- Handle the rooms and apartments with care
- Make payments on time to avoid stress with your landlord; payment in Germany is always made via bank transfer





- No tuition, but semester fee of 72 € per semester tp pay for for meals in the canteen, psychological and legal counselling
- Average expenses of a German Student/ living costs per month:

Rent (including utility costs): 410 €

Food: 198 €

Clothing: 46 €

Transportation (car/public transport): 89 €

Health (insurance, doctor's fee, medication): 100 €

Telephone/internet/radio and TV: 31 €

Working materials (books etc.) and semester fee: 67 €

Recreation, culture and sports: 65 €


Additional expenditures: 144 €

TOTAL: 1,150 €





- A blocked account is a special bank account required by German immigration authorities for visa applicants. It proves you have sufficient funds to support yourself during your stay in Germany.
- the German embassy has set sum at 992 € per month, or 11,904 € per annum. You can also check the information
